## Year 2 Zoologists

On Friday 26th May, Year 2 went on a Science trip to the Zoological Society of London (ZSL) Whipsnade Zoo. The children have been learning about 'Living Things and their habitat' and 'Animals including humans' and are currently looking at animals including humans in their Science lessons. At the zoo, they viewed and learnt about different animals from around the world and their habitats, mini beasts and life cycles of a range of animals. They were very engaged as they participated in a life cycle workshop, where they explored how a variety of different animals grow, develop and produce offspring. The children considered their own life cycle before going on to compare the life cycles of a variety of different animals. Using costumes and role laying, they created and acted out a butterfly cycle, before being led on a tour of the butterfly house where they had a chance to reinforce their learning by searching for the real-life stages of a butterfly life cycle. The children had a lot of fun and an amazing experience learning about the animals and minibeasts from around the world.

We would like to remind parents, guardians and carers that it is essential for books to remain in your children's book bags and brought to school on a daily basis.


## Key Stage 1 Phonics Screening Check Week

From Monday 12th to Friday 16th June, Year 1 will be taking part in their Phonics Screening Check is meant to show how well your child can use the end of Year 1 and to identify children who need extra phonics help. The check consists of 40 words and non-words that your child will be asked to read one-onone with a teacher. You can help your child prepare for their Phonics Screening Check by going over the phonics they have learned in Reception and Year 1 Parents, guardians and carers are reminded to read new books and stories with their children where they will be introduced to new words that they will have to sound out. They should encourage their children to review the phonics sounds and rules that are in the middle of the Reading Records. All the best to our Year 1 children with their Phonics Check!



## Multiplication Tables Check- Year 4

From Monday 5th to Friday 16th June, our Year 4 children will be taking their Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) at school, which became statutory in September 2021. The MTC is a Key Stage 2 assessment to be taken by children at the end of Year 4 in June. It is an online test where children are asked 25 questions on times tables from 2 to 12. For every question, the children will have 6 seconds to answer, and in between the questions, there is a 3-second rest. Questions about the 6, 7, 8, 9, and 12 times tables come up more often. The questions are generated randomly based on the rules of the MTC. The MTC's purpose is to ensure the children's knowledge of their times tables knowledge is at the expected level. Parents, guardians and carers are being asked to ensure that the children practice their timetables on a daily basis using online different games which will be of great benefit in preparing them for the Multiplication Tables Check. 


#### Water Bottles - Warm Weather

#### Reading with your Children!

Reading books aloud to children stimulates their imagination. It helps them develop language and listening skills and prepares them to understand the written word. With this in mind we urge all parents, guardians and carers to share a book with your children at bedtime. For the little ones this may be simply looking at a picture book and introducing key vocabulary. For the older ones, it would be really good to start with some simple stories, by reading out loud to your child. If you need any advice on reading to your child, please do not hesitate to contact the school.



#### **Urgent Attention - Child Safety!**

Whilst we appreciate that parents, quardians and carers are often very busy rushing to pick up or drop off children to school, we must ask you to think carefully about where and how you park your vehicles. Unfortunately, inconsiderate parking by some is becoming a concern in the road outside the school as it is causing serious congestion and therefore is a hazard to children crossing the road at the beginning and end of the school day. Parking close to the school gates or double parking, may save a couple of minutes when dropping off or picking up your children, but it increases the risk of an accident because it reduces the visibility of children crossing the road to access or leave school. 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
