

## Map Skills - Geography

Year 4 pupils in New Dehli have been looking at discovering the effects of tectonic plates. On Thursday 17th September, pupils engaged in a tactile activity, attentively cutting along the dotted lines of the earth's surface to replicate these plates. The children then challenged themselves by attempting to reassemble the cut-out fragments, cementing their knowledge of tectonic plates and what happens when two plates meet! All pupils met the task with great enthusiasm and resourcefulness, utilising the atlas as a guide.



## Capture an Ariel View – Geography

Putting it in perspective, on Monday 28th September, pupils in Year 1 Stockholm journeyed to the rooftop of the School's greenhouse to visualise and capture the concept of an ariel view. The pupils embraced the opportunity to observe objects from different perspectives, supporting their understanding of aerial photographs and gaining an insight into how the same objects can be seen from various angles. They enjoyed pointing out prominent features on the School grounds and explained how this angle made them feel like birds in the sky, providing them with an exciting and engaging learning experience.

On Tuesday 29th September, pupils in Year 5 have been flexing their muscles and testing their agility, playing sports on the School's field. Pupils engaged in various activities, allowing them to develop their motor skills further, enhance their reflexes and improve hand-eye coordination, enabling them to succeed in many kinds of physical activities.

### School Lunches

Over the summer holidays, we had launched our new cashless system - iPayimpact, where parents, guardians and carers were each given a unique reference code via letter to set up their children's accounts. **Registration must be completed in order to make payments online.** You may have noticed that individual lunch prices have changed to £2.40 per day (£12.00 for the week). We would like to encourage parents, guardians and carers to pre-order their child's lunch for the week; this includes all children in receipt of free school meals, either selecting packed lunch or the School dinner choice of that day (Halal, Non-Halal or Vegetarian). You can select meals for seven weeks therefore avoiding logging in weekly. The lunch option will be displayed on the iPay account in case you are unsure of what is being served for that day. Parents, guardians and carers of children in Reception and Years 1 and 2 must pre-order meals online weekly. We would like to thank all families that have already registered their account.
