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On Thursday 1st October, pupils in Madrid and Berlin explored numeracy by identifying numbers and counting objects.


With a tactile-based approach to learning, the activity encouraged interaction amongst peers, improving pupils' retention in Mathematics and allowing them to remain engaged throughout. Learning through play is an extremely valuable learning tool especially at such a young age.

The children mastered various techniques including repeated patterns and developed their collage skills by firmly pressing the painted side of the food firmly onto paper to achieve an assemblage of different prints in different colours. The activity was carried out for pupils to gain a better understanding into what the Harvest Festival involves, why we participate in it and why we should appreciate all the hard work the farmers do, all while having fun!











Area Mapping

Both Helsinki and Stockholm classes went on a delightful tour of the School in order to support their recent learning intentions of Geography. On Monday 5th October, Year 1 explored the School grounds, identifying areas near and far away from their classroom. It was a wonderful opportunity for our children to develop reflective and inquisitive thinking as they discovered various routes leading to the same destination!







Sweets Containing Psychoactive Ingredients

We would like to warn all parents, guardians and carers of the dangers of the 'Medicated Nerds Rope Bites' sweet which appears to have dangerous levels of the psychoactive chemical THC. They have been reported to have negative effects on children with symptoms including nausea, hyperactivity, elevated heart rates and hallucinations and the police have issued a warning to families about the potential risks of consuming these sweets. We urge parents, guardians and carers to be extra vigilant about what their children are eating and to reinforce the importance of developing healthy eating habits and making safe choices when buying snacks from outside.

Holiday Requests

Parents, guardians and carers, please remember the importance of factoring any potential quarantine restrictions into your holiday, so that if any quarantine measures are required, these do not impact on your child's return to school in November. The October half term is only one week and, in most cases, you may have to quarantine for 14 days when you travel to a country and when you return to the United Kingdom. The Department for Education (DfE) guidance states that school attendance is mandatory so all absences will be referred and logged as unauthorised. Any term time holiday requests must be sent to the Headteacher in writing at least one month prior to travelling and before securing any travel arrangements.

Reading with your Children!

Reading books aloud to children stimulates their imagination. It helps them develop language and listening skills and prepares them to understand the written word. With this in mind, we urge all parents, guardians and carers to share a book with your children at bedtime. For the little ones, this may be simply looking at a picture book and introducing key vocabulary. For the older ones, it would be really good to start with some simple stories, by reading out loud to your child. We would like to inform all parents, guardians and carers of children born between 1st September 2009 and 31st August 2010 that the closing date for applications for Secondary School places to be received by the London Borough of Hillingdon, by post or online, is **Saturday 31st October 2020.** To ensure your application arrives on time and in order to give your child the best possible chance of being offered the school of your choice, we would advise that you submit your applications no later than Friday 23rd October to ensure that it is received by the published deadline. You will receive information with regard to applying for your child starting secondary school shortly.

Primary School Admissions 2021

We would like to inform all parents, guardians and carers of children born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017 that the closing date for applications for Primary School places to be received by the London Borough of Hillingdon, by post or online, is midnight on **Friday 15th January 2021**. To ensure your application arrives on time and in order to give your child the best possible chance of being offered the school of your choice, we would advise that you submit your applications prior to the Christmas holiday period. The London Borough of Hillingdon states on their website that they cannot be held responsible for any delays in applications due to problems with postal or Internet service providers.
