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'United Nations' at Brookside



On Friday 2nd July, Year 5 Dakar class transformed the playground into a 'United Nations debate chamber', where they embraced their philosophical reasoning skills in a round of debates, while still remembering to be reflective and respectful.

To enhance these skills, the children ferociously researched, planned and wrote a one-sided argument to highlight national environmental issues. They successfully included many persuasive features to bring awareness to how littering and pollution negatively impacts on our environment.

The pupils have proven to be articulate and assertive, and ready to take on the challenges that may arise in Year 6.



Sweet Mathematics

Year 6 have been using 'Skittles' to create a range of graphs to identify how many of each colour there were. The children collected data using tally charts, pictograms and bar graphs, before calculating the mean, mode, median and range. They enjoyed learning how to evaluate data, enhancing their central tendency skills, and thoroughly relished the opportunity to devour the sweets afterwards!




Light Travels for Year 3

On Tuesday 29th June, the Year 3 children learnt about the physics of light in an experiment designed to identify whether light travels in a straight line or not, using index cards and flashlights to test this.

As the index card is opaque, it should not allow for light to go through. Therefore, the children punched holes in the centre of the index cards and stood them up vertically, placing them each at an equal distance from each other to observe the path of the light coming through. They recorded their observations and discovered that if the holes are in alignment, light will travel in a straight line. Throughout this activity, the children demonstrated their ability to make an observation, make a hypothesis and test their hypothesis. Well done all!

iPayimpact

Conjunctivitis – Please be on the Lookout

Conjunctivitis is a common eye infection that affects children. It can be caused by either an infection or an allergy and is contagious. If your child is showing signs of conjunctivitis or if you believe your child's infection is bacterial, it is prudent to visit your child's paediatrician to determine whether they need drops. Symptoms can range from watery eyes to discharge in one or both eyes. If your child is experiencing either of the above, please ensure that they are kept at home until the discharge from the eyes has cleared to prevent the infection from spreading to others. It is crucial that you also notify the School of their reason for absence.

Please continue to reiterate the importance of hand hygiene and encourage your child to wash their hands thoroughly and regularly throughout the day.
